



## Beresheit ch. 22

Some time afterward, God put Abraham to the test. He said to him, "Abraham," and he answered, "Here I am."

And He said, "Take your son, your favored one, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and bring him up there as/ for a burnt offering on one of the heights that I will point out to you."

So he **awoke** early next morning, Abraham **saddled** his ass and **took** with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. He **split** the wood for the burnt offering, and he **set out** for the place of which God had told him

On the third day, Abraham **looked up** and **saw** the place from afar.

Then Abraham said to his servants, "You stay here with the donkey. The boy and I will go up there; we will worship and we will return to you."

Abraham **took** the wood for the burnt offering and **placed** it on his son Isaac. He himself **took** the firestone<sup>a</sup> *Lit. "fire."* and the knife; and the two walked off together.

Then Isaac said to his father Abraham, "Father!" And he answered, "Yes, my son." And he said, "Here are the firestone and the wood; but where is the sheep for the burnt offering?"

And Abraham said, "God will see to / choose the sheep for His burnt offering, my son." And the two of them walked on together.

They arrived at the place of which God had told him. Abraham **built** an altar there; he **laid out** the wood; he **bound** his son Isaac; he **laid** him on the altar, on top of the wood.

And Abraham **picked** up the knife **to slay** his son.

Then an angel of the LORD called to him from heaven: "Abraham! Abraham!" And he answered, "Here I am."

When Abraham looked up, his eye fell upon a ram, caught in the thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering in place of his son.

And Abraham named that site Adonai-yireh (God will see / choose) hence the present saying, "On the mount of the LORD He (the presence of God)/ he (the one or nation who sacrifices) will be seen / chosen.

The angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven, and said, "By Myself I swear (language of an OATH), such the LORD declares: Because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your favored one,

I will bestow My blessing upon you and make your **descendants** as numerous as the stars of heaven and the sands on the seashore; and your descendants shall **inherit the gates** (towns) of their

All the nations of the earth shall become **blessed** by your descendants, because you have obeyed My voice."

Abraham then returned to his servants, and they departed together for Beersheba; and Abraham stayed in Beersheba.

The absolute self surrender characteristic of idolatry in which primitive man found his be all and end all, until it triumphed over parental pity and made cruelty towards sons and daughters the keynote of Molech worship, springs from an inner hidden conviction that the Divine is more precious than anything else and all that is beloved and admired is as nought before it.

...When the Divine light had to shine forth in its purity, it was revealed in the fierceness of its brightness in the trial of Avraham which showed that the passion and self surrender in a Divine cause did not have to take the disgusting form of idol worship in which the Divine spark of good has become completely lost...

All these are obvious matters. The distinctive and unusual feature added here is that the self surrender involved in communion with the Divine on the higher spiritual plane can be no less ecstatic....
